God, Peace and Mental Health

I had a beautiful experience with Google in preparation for this article. I selected "images" and typed the word "Peace." Virtually all of the images for the word "Peace" had a reference to God or Jesus. I felt elated that even Google knows the correlation between God and peace.

Then, I substituted the words "Mental Health" in place of the word "Peace" in all the quotes I read. My experience was profoundly changed making peace and mental health synonymous. When someone is in a mentally healthy state of mind, peace exists. With emotional regulation and perceptions that keep situations calm, households live in peace. Workplace environments of mutual respect and support cause the employees to feel peaceful about their positions.



I am reminded of the Fruits of the Spirit when I see them displayed prominently in our Narthex, and I endeavor to live life fulfilling the meaning behind each of the words. I now especially love the reference to peace with mental health. 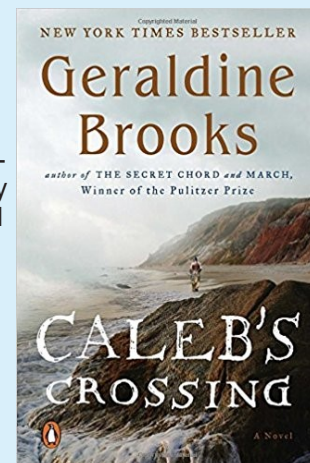

When my Care Receiver stepped through the doorway, it was obvious she had been crying. "What happened, I asked because through all our times together, even through some difficult times, I had never seen her cry. Breaking out in another sob, she answered, "I have to move. We will be going as a family and I have to go to help with the children since the parents both work. It isn't that I mind relocating, but I have come so far with your help in just beginning to have a voice that I can't imagine not having someone to listen and help me go further."

But this is a story with a happy ending. Anona's Stephen Ministry is one of 12,000 in all American states, Canada and 29 other countries. There are 179 denominations which use Stephen Ministry, and fortunately a United Methodist church in the town where my Care Receiver moved happily provided a Stephen Minister for her, and her progress continued.

Through the central list maintained by Stephen Ministry headquarters in St. Louis, MO, local Stephen Leaders are privileged to be able to address needs beyond our own church. In 2017, we did four such referrals.

In addition, Stephen Ministry provides Leadership Training each year for Stephen Ministers who wish to have further training at the national level and serve as a Stephen Leader at the local level. (OUR ACTION HERE-LARRY AND PAUL)

Caring for our Anona Congregation

Each week we visit in area hospitals, rehab centers, and call on persons who are unable to come to Church. We rely on our members to let us know when they or a loved one needs special attention. Please call the church office to keep us in the know. If you are calling about someone other than a family member, make sure they give their permission for our visit. If you receive the recorded message when you call, please enter 225 and follow the prompts to leave a message. Be sure and give us your name and number so we can follow through if there are questions. This extension is monitored three times a day so that we may respond quickly with one of our teams.

Heath Care Team—Men's Prostate Health (April is Prostate Cancer month)

Prostate Cancer: Starts when cells in the prostate grow out of control. The prostate is the size of a walnut. If the prostate grows too large, it squeezes the urethra. This may slow or stop the normal flow of urine. This can be danger sign. Older men, and those with a family history, are more at risk. One of the ways your doctor might make a diagnosis, is to order a PSA (Prostate Specific Antigen).

PSA is a substance in the blood that is made by the prostate gland. Elevated levels may indicate cancer of the prostate. It is recommend that you should have this test starting at age 50, but before that if you have a family history of this type cancer.
