Advent begins four weeks before December 25th, and celebrates the season with the theme of Christ coming.

That theme is lifted historically in three ways:

That He came as the gift of God to the world to show God's love and forgiveness and to teach the Way, following Him into an Abundant life now and a Heavenly life after we die.

That He will come again and usher in a new Heaven and Earth where the Kingdom of God will reign.

And finally, that He comes into our hearts when we open ourselves to the Spirit which is so felt during this Season.

We will be exploring how Biblical characters felt as He came. We will start with Simeon at the temple, then Zechariah and Elizabeth, then Joseph, and finally the Shepherds. Not the usual list.

We will work really hard on the music, the decorations, the sermons, and the preparation so that every pathway to you opening your heart to Him will be prepared. The advent season is a beautiful spiritual time. Church reorients us during this time—away from the business, the lists, the obligations, and the secular draws. Being in Church focuses us on what refreshes and refills our spirit.

Please remember also that your Church depends on the Christmas Season to make it financially through the year. Make the last gift on your list to the Christ Child as you light a candle for those you love, to show your faith, and to worship Christ, the Hope of the World.

December 2 An Unexpected Christmas Luke 2:25

Have you ever experienced something unexpected in your life? (Maybe even around the Christmas season?) This morning we're going to explore the story of Simeon, and how God is at work in our lives even when the unexpected happens.

December 9 Zechariah and Elizabeth Luke 1:5-18

Mary and Joseph were not the only couple angels appeared to who conceived a miraculous child. Elizabeth was old and barren, and Zechariah was too (we don't have a consult to see whose actual problem with fertility it was). Because Zechariah doubted and wanted proof he was struck dumb. Late in life we think things are set and we are needing to accept the way things are. Then God happens. Suddenly there is a new chapter. The couple was assured this would be a good thing. My hope for you this Sunday in the changing chapters of life is that you believe in the power of God to take the life you have and add another chapter.

December 16 Joseph Matthew 1:18-25

Joseph was a good man, unwilling to shame Mary and have her pregnancy made public. He was going to end their relationship quietly when an Angel told him to not be afraid, this was from God. What was going to be kept quiet ended up the most talked about birth in human history. We often keep our pain, our embarrassment, our shame quiet and suffer. Our God makes butterflies from worms, diamonds from coal, and tough experiences into tough people, foolish decisions into wisdom, and mistakes into learning. We "fail forward". With God in the mix, miraculous and surprising good fortune come from what has broken and scarred us. This Christmas Season may the God of diamonds and butterflies turn your dirty, black, worthless coal into something precious.

December 23 The Unnoticed...Noticed Luke 2:8-20

The story of the shepherds is the story of flying under the radar. They were the hidden ones, the ones that worked behind the scenes. Without them, however, what happened in the temple – worship through sacrifice – would stop in its tracks. Even at the beginning of the story of Jesus, however, the unnoticed get noticed.

The Lessons of Compassion and Generosity

School begins and then, before you know it, it is Christmas! It always amazes us how quickly the Christmas season creeps up on us. With all of the busyness and wants and needs pressuring us, how do we remain present, aware, and focused so we can help our children experience the true meaning of this wonderful season of hope and love?

Conscious Discipline[®] teaches Compassion and Generosity through the Power of Acceptance and the Skill of Empathy. The Power of Acceptance says, "The moment is as it is." Accepting this fact values each person present and offers the opportunity to see the situation without judgment. We are then able to access the Skill of Empathy. Empathy is the skill that helps us handle the upset and process the feelings.

Empathy wires the brain for self-regulation, is the heart of emotional intelligence, and is achieved through compassion for others. It teaches us to generously offer to others that which we have, seek to be helpful and kind, and care for our world. When we see the upsets of others, rather than judge their behavior, simply offer, "You seem _____. Something happened." This allows the person to share his/her feelings rather than defend their actions, resulting in a win-win for all.

This requires our willingness to give the gift of our time and attention to our children in the midst of our "busy" and during the upsets. It is not easy, however, this gift will last forever, wiring them with compassion and generosity. We wish you all a very joyous and peaceful Christmas!







What happened to Joseph, Jesus' earthly father? What the Bible does tell us about Joseph is that Joseph was descended from a line of kings going back to David. That he was a carpenter who lived and worked in Nazareth. That an angel appeared to him to tell him Mary was to have a child, a child not conceived by him. That, to avoid public scorn, Joseph took pregnant Mary home to become his wife, Matt 1:24. Then he took her to Bethlehem to



be counted in a census. Did he safely escort her to "a city in Judah" to visit her cousin Elizabeth during these women's pregnancies? Nothing is said in Luke. Then we see Joseph taking Mary to Bethlehem and finding no lodging available settling into a manger used to keep animals. Once again, an angel warned him to gather up his family and flee Bethlehem and go to Egypt. After a while, following the death of Herod the Great, things calmed down back in Jerusalem, and Joseph took his family out of Egypt and back to Nazareth. Until Jesus was 12, nothing more was said about Jesus or his parents. It is believed Mary had more children: James, Joses, Simon, and others, these to Joseph, their real dad. An apocryphal writing, the Gospel of James written around 145 AD, has James being born to Joseph and a previous wife before the incident involving a very young Mary, making Joseph much older than imagined. If James was already born to Joseph in a previous marriage, Matthew doesn't mention him with the family fleeing to Egypt. Joseph obediently accepted the role of adoptive father in Jesus' early life. Matt. 1-24. And somewhere between the 12-year old Jesus' return to Nazareth with his family and when Jesus was 30 years old and appeared before John the Baptist at the Jordan River, Joseph disappeared or died. John 6:42 almost sounds like Joseph was still alive when someone mentioned, "Is not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we already know?" Yet, during Jesus' 3 plus years' ministry, his mother is portrayed as a widow. In John 19:27, Jesus asks John to be Mary's caretaker. Joseph demonstrated his faithful integrity and devotion to God when he and Mary took Jesus to have him dedicated at the temple 8 days after his birth and when he took his family to Jerusalem to celebrate Passover, perhaps more than once, not the least being when Jesus was 12. There is no quote in the Bible from anything Joseph ever said. There is no mention of this Joseph in the Gospel of Mark, and only once in the Gospel of John.

The Long Haul



Stephen Ministers are committed to providing high-quality, confidential, Christ-centered care to people who are hurting. There are a number of situations in life that may cause this hurt: grief, divorce, cancer, hospitalization, long-term care, chronic illness, terminal illness, job loss, loss of a home, military deployment, the onset of a disability, spiritual crisis, and so many that are personal and specific. These are the struggles of life, and Stephen Ministry is there!

There are times when the issue which brings someone to a Stephen Minister is not the real underlying reason for the struggle of the care receiver. A Stephen Minister is trained to listen and to ask the perceptive questions which may reveal to the individual what else may be involved.

We are sometimes asked how long we will give care to an individual in the caring relationship. Although we will maintain Stephen Ministry boundaries, there is no set time frame. A caring relationship can be brought to closure when a period of time has passed, and the care receiver has reached these points, 1) the care receiver's behavior shows that he/she has pretty much recovered from the crisis that brought you together, 2) the care receiver no longer has crucial problems to discuss and does not appear to be hiding any, and 3) the care receiver is consistently, genuinely happy.

Many times a Stephen Minister becomes "knee deep" in that person's life. A high level of trust has been attained, the relationship has been kept confidential and our Lord has been present during our contacts with the care receiver. As a result, the Stephen Minister is often among the very few, often the only person, that the care receiver will reach out to for support and encouragement in a further need.



As Stephen Ministers, we will be with the care receiver for the long haul. Our commitment is to invite Christ into our relationships for as long as our care receivers need us to walk alongside them.
