July Worship at Anona

In the first Sunday of June I preached (in our two traditional and contemporary) on Ephesians 2 where Christ has come to put to death the hostility between us. As we move into July, having covered the "indivisible" portion of our pledge of allegiance, I would like to add the Christian concepts of Liberty and Justice. For good measure I've added Mercy. The founding mothers and fathers of our nation had the Christian worldview as a default, assumed, and even unconscious perspective. It was the era of "Christendom" where it was assumed that everyone you met was some sort of Christian.

Our Constitution, Pledge, and Declaration of Independence all come from that worldview.

Today, we don't assume that world view is shared by everyone. You can't assume when your talking to the check-out person in a store that they know the Christian values of unity, liberty, justice, and mercy. Around 75% of Americans identify with a Christian denomination, but only around 37% percent are weekly attenders and that can be as low as 22% in some reports. In other words, though the majority identify, active participation in a culture that promotes the principles and character of a Christian may not be there.

So, what does that mean? Can we take for granted that world view? As an example, we might say "I appealed to his sense of justice". Can we assume the person we're talking to has a sense of justice? We would assume from that worldview that we are "indivisible". Are we?

Let's enjoy the month of July covering the basics that formed our ethos (the characteristic spirit of a culture).

July 1 Freedom (Liberty)

These scriptures and dozens more talk about liberty as a central value, even a reason for Christ's actions. In Luke it is Jesus telling us about his mission. In Galatians it is an admonition to stay free and not slip back into bondage. We are entrapped and ensnared by so much. Do we yet "yearn to breath free"? My prayer for you on this day is that you shake off the bonds that hold you down and bruise you and breath free.

July 8 Justice Micah 6:8 and Amos 5:24

Micah urges us to "do" justice. Amos quotes God saying "Let Justice roll down like waters". Martin Luther King Jr. quoted that in his "I Have A Dream" speech. Both passages are talking about the sacrifice acceptable to God. Do each of us live by our sense of justice? What is that? How critical to our moral and character nature is that? Is it essential for the Christian life? My prayer for you on this day is that your sense of Justice is your offering to your God.

July 15 Mercy James 2:13 and Matthew 18:21-24

The "Prayer of Humble Access" used by the Methodist, Episcopal, Church of England, and Roman Catholic churches says that "God's property is always to have mercy". It is a guiding principle in my life. If we are to be godly, mercy must be constantly before us. Just as First John 4:8 says "The one who does not love does not know God", James says "those who show not mercy will receive no mercy". I don't know about you, but I need mercy. I would like to face a mercy-full God. My prayer for you on this day is that Mercy both flows from you and to you.

July 22 Throw It All 1 Peter 5:6-11

From the time of our youth on we tend to juggle a lot: school, friends, sports, dating, and social media give way to spouses, family, and jobs...maybe even church. It can be hard to keep all of this in balance—especially when our stress builds and feels so overwhelming. What worries or concerns you too much right now...what if you could just throw it all away?

July 29 Hope Full or Less Acts 16:18-19 & 22-25

We Are Underway!

I am excited to share that we're moving into our next phase of renovations on our church home. Back in the Spring we were able to make some much-needed technical upgrades for our Traditional and Contemporary worship spaces, and this summer we will begin the physical renovation work in and around our Traditional sanctuary. We will be remodeling the front chancel to be more senior-adult friendly with better rails and steps, a ramp for the lower chancel, much needed carpet replacement, the addition of video screens that fit the Traditional feel of the space, and leveling out some of the sidewalks outside the sanctuary entrance on Indian Rocks Road to make them safer to use.



We are still waiting to receive final clearance to begin so we don't have an official start date yet, but hope to begin construction sometime in mid to late July. Construction is expected to last 45-60 days, so we are busy working on a plan to temporarily re-locate our 8:15 and 11:10 Traditional services over to the Contemporary Sanctuary during the construction

My senior year of high school I went on a trip with the Florida Conference Youth Department to New York City and Washington D.C. For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another." In God's kingdom, our freedom should not be used for our own gain, but for service to one another. Christ set the example, as a servant leader.



• A creative, imaginative approach to spiritual guidance for children that lets them explore their faith through play, stories, and parables from the bible.


Small Group Explore, for K – 5th grade students; available at the 11:10 am & 5 pm services:

How To Get What You Want From Others

Most people who enter a Counselor's office are in emotional distress because of what someone else did or said to them. While it is true that good people have really terrible things happen, just as true is that many people want others to do something else, say other words, or be different in some way.

Well, I can help you stay out of the counselor's office by sharing with you how to get what you want from others. Are you intrigued yet?





Seek Justice: No, not retribution. The word 'justice' is often confused with judgement. The true definition of 'justice' is just behavior or treatment. The word 'just' is defined as being fair. So, justice means behavior that is fair. But, instead of seeking it from others, turn your eyes inward and seek personal behavior that is fair.

Love Mercy: Mercy is defined as compassion or forgiveness. Since everyone you know is a fallible human being, having a compassionate heart and being willing to forgive improves relationships abundantly.

Walk Humbly with God. See others how God sees them, especially those who have caused you hurt. In this way you will see past their actions through to the cause of their behavior.

Freedom is meeting your own emotional needs without reliance on others. You can get what you want from others by removing the need you place on them to provide you what you need. 
