March Worship at Anona

The month of March brings us up to and almost at Easter, but Easter this month is April first. The devotional we are using (still time to get one, check website or ask someone Sunday morning) is by N.T. Wright, who is the Chair of New Testament at the University of St. Andrews, and was a bishop of the Church of England. He is a spiritual heavyweight.

Having covered the big areas of Temptation and Transfiguration in the latter part of February (or the first part of Lent), we now move on to the Kingdom, Forgiveness, and Judgement before encountering Holy Week.

We will be reading the entirety of the book of Matthew along with selected Psalms. The vision for our Lenten experience is that from the beginning of Lent (Ash Wednesday) to its conclusion at Easter, your spirit connects with the living God in ways that will be relevant to your own life. That was Bishop Wright's hope for this Lenten series.

I think that's my hope for Church in general. It should always be relevant to your life. The gospel is, and always has been for "every day". It is your "go to", constantly available, constantly used, consistently useful and helpful for living "every day". That's why Dr. Wright entitled his book that goes with this study "Lent for Everyone".

Let this Lent be that for you. A time of refreshing your use of the gospel every day. Like gas in a car or electricity for a lamp, it is meant to give up power to run on every day.

March 4 The Kingdom of Heaven is Like...

Matthew 13:31-33; 44-46

I have always admired people who project a calm, peaceful presence in the midst of chaos. They have a way of bringing a sense of peace to all around them as they move in and out of the noisy, messy, turbulent and stressful situation in which they find themselves. I have seen it in people in the midst of some accident as well as people in the midst of their daily work. The people I have known who have this ability or gift also have a deep spiritual faith.

Jesus was often in crowds of people, teaching, preaching, healing and in the midst of his ministry, people were pressing in, wanting to touch him, wanting to hear him, wanting to be in his presence. The disciples were often trying to give him. room and space, trying to keep people away. Jesus had a strong spiritual connection to his Father, and would often "withdraw" from the crowds to pray. Mark's gospel lists numerous occasions when Jesus would go off alone, or with his disciples to find solitude and commune with God. Jesus continually sought God's wisdom, God's strength and God's peace in his live and he was intentional about taking the time to grow deeper.

Do you wish you had more peace in your life? Do you find yourself worried, and fretting over an endless number of situations you or your family face? Do you feel you are facing the noisy, messy, turbulent and stressful world with no end in sight? Jesus said, (John 16:33) "I've said these things to you so that you will have peace in me. In the world you have distress. But be encouraged! I have conquered the world." Follow Jesus example; withdraw to seek God's wisdom, strength and peace. Make worship a part your spiritual habit, Be in solitude to talk (pray) and listen for God. Be intentional about taking the time to grow deeper. Peace and Blessings!



It's Easter is one month away...just 31 days.

We're in the midst of Lent, which started on Ash Wednesday (that happened to be Valentine's Day this year). Lent is normally 40 days long plus Sundays making it about six weeks in total. It offers us the opportunity to use that time to reflect on our life and priorities in light of what Christ did for us at the end of this season on Easter Sunday. With 31 days left in Lent...31 days to Easter, I'm wondering what can we do in that time?

Lent isn't something to mix up with something like New Year's resolutions. Many times, when we do New Year's resolutions, they're about us... getting ourselves in shape, focusing on our finances, or quitting a bad

habit. Lent is different. It's about honoring Christ by changing the pattern of our lives in ways that seek to draw us closer to him. What can we do in 31 days to honor Christ with our life?



I don't know the answer to those questions, but I do know that when we seek to draw close to God, God is honored and something changes. It might be so subtle as to be unnoticeable or so dramatic as to be impossible to miss, but something changes and the change is for the good. I would love that to happen to each one of us and to our church as a community. If you're ready to give 31 days, I invite you to visit our Facebook page (facebook.com/anonachurch) every day in March. Each day I will post a way for you to practice your faith as we all seek to draw close to Christ. What can we do in 31 days? Let's find out together!

March 4 Getting Even or Giving Mercy Matthew 18:21-35

You have heard it said, "An eye for an eye, tooth for a tooth" (Matthew 5:38). That quick quote from Jesus actually comes from Exodus 21:24, which doesn't stop there...it also includes a lot more, "life for life, hand for hand, foot for foot, burn for burn, wound for wound"...you get the idea. Justice or mercy...which one applies to us?

March 11 The Consequences of Character Matthew 23:37-39

We often look at the nice words of Jesus and avoid the moments where he is a bit more on the confrontational side...the places where we might even say he appears quite rude. In fact, there are moments where he sounds more like a Marine drill sergeant than a grace-filled Savior. This week we look at the Drill Sergeant Savior side of Jesus.

March 18 Empowered for Something More Matthew 25:14-30

When we think back over the course of our lives, we can often find at least one or two people that helped us take a step up or at least forward. We can think of people that trusted us with something important, even when we didn't feel ready for the responsibility. It's called empowerment, and it's crucial to the Christian journey.



Youth Sermon Series - "Back To Life"








God in Your Coffee Cup

Families receive housing and other support systems to reduce negative impact on them, especially the children. Single residents have access to three stages of housing including short-term emergency, moderate-term transitional and long-term permanent supportive housing. All services are geared toward eventual self-sufficiency. Residents can access, medical, dental and mental health services provided by HEP and also through their many community partners. A vast array of volunteer opportunities are available at HEP including providing professional services, thrift store help, maintenance/landscaping, food donation pickups, medical services, office work, kitchen (serving meals, food prep, cleaning), work in the learning center, and assistance directly to the veterans. 

"Wait for the Lord. Be strong and don't lose hope. Wait for the Lord." Psalm 27:14, NIV

Not only did David have times where he impatiently waited upon the Lord to help him get through his trials and tribulations with King Saul, David's son as King Solomon wrote many of the proverbs comparing the patience of men who are wise to the impatience of those who think and act foolishly.

The Book of Proverbs can be a great training manual for young men starting out in life and even those older men who find themselves bemoaning the things they've lost or missed out on.
