Growing in Giving, in Serving, in Grace

Over a year ago we put together a team of people to create last year's finance campaign called "Beyond." It was an invitation to think and go beyond ourselves, our walls and our limits when it came to generosity and service. One of the things we felt led to invite Anona into, was the idea of growing toward the Biblical principle of the tithe...giving at least 10% of our income to serve God's work in the world through the church. What we recognized at that time was the need to emphasize growth, not merely accomplishment. The journey is as important as the goal.

The beauty of growth is that it is visible. I want to lift up how Anona went "beyond" in its growth in 2018. The invitation last year was to prayerfully consider growing toward the tithe by increasing our individual or family giving by ten percent. For example, if a person or family was currently offering \$20 per week in 2017, we invited them to consider increasing that to \$22 per week for 2018. We knew that if our congregation embraced the spiritual practice of generosity, our faith would grow and our church would be empowered for ministry. The result...at the end of September we were running nearly \$97,000 ahead of 2017 at the same time of the year! You stepped out in faith and our church is impacting our community and world more powerfully as a result:

- * More and more children are learning to read and more kids are receiving meals in food insecure homes
- * Our youth traveled to Houston and Key West to help people recover from hurricanes
- * We held a summer worship camp for kids that has reinvigorated our FX Worship Service
- * We launched dozens of families toward financial security through Financial Peace University

That's only a snapshot of what Anona has done in the name of Christ. Bottom line, because of your faith to take a step forward toward the tithe, lives are being transformed...those who give, those who serve and those we are serving.

Our theme for 2019 we will centered on growing in giving, in serving and in grace. We'll be focused on generosity this month, and I pray we are all ready to take our next ten percent step of faith. If we do, imagine what we can accomplish in 2019! Let's pray that God will bless Anona's mission and give us a spirit of growing generosity that continues to transform lives. Let's grow in giving, in serving, and in grace.

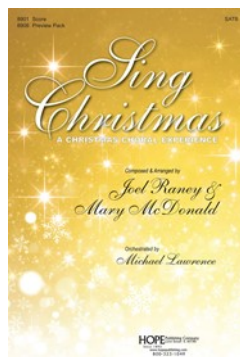

Unity... We're All in This, Together Building the School Family

At Anona Child Development Center we work to create an environment of safety and trust where the School Family can partner with home families to establish a relationship of unity and connection. Our partnership with our families is essential in the growth and development of the children. Parents are their first teachers! In the classroom, the School Family environment of safety and trust helps to create a sense of belonging for all children. They are safe, have responsibilities, and, through meaningful contributions, learn that they are an integral part of the family. When we are connected, and know we belong, we are more willing to choose to work together for the success of the whole group. Cooperation follows connection.

Within the School Family environment, classroom management isn't based on simply following rules, but on the safe relationships that exist between the children and adults, and between the children themselves. These relationships motivate cooperation and create a positive learning environment where maximum learning potential can be achieved. This is the power of Unity in Conscious Discipline®.

The power of Unity aids in developing our innate desire to be helpful and of service. We do what we do and we make the choices we make because it is the right thing to do; not because we receive rewards or avoid punishment. It truly is The Golden Rule, "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you."

The children are also learning about their community and how they can be helpful and contribute to others around them through Community Connections. For the month of November, the children and families are participating in Sweet Dreams. This program supports the Florida UM Children's Home by providing linens and night time comforts for the residents of the UMCH. These gifts of new linens, stuffed animals or blankets help children have Sweet Dreams. Children helping children; what a beautiful connection!

The first stage of FX is Discover: where children under 5 learn to discover God for themselves.



The next stage of FX is Explore: where children Pre-K to 5th grade explore their relationship with God.

Discover: It's important to remember that God's got it, no matter what happens in life. When we are in the midst of fear and seemingly impossible circumstances, God is there with us. For October, we are exploring how to "Always give thanks to God." Ephesians 5:20, NCV

Explore: Each month our younger students explore a life app. We will be diving into Cooperation.

Small Group Explore, for K – 5th grade students: available at the 11:10 am & 5 pm services:

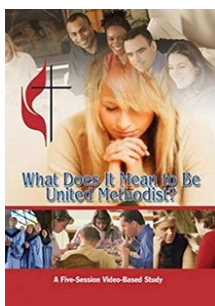

Grief ~ Gratitude ~ God

Other months we manage turbulent emotions, and then comes "The Holidays." The Holidays seem to hold a giant magnifying glass when faced with loss, grief, sadness, change. Worse is when we are expected to be of good cheer while privately sinking into the deep well of despair.

How do you get to gratitude in the presence of grief?

First, I want to acknowledge your hurt if you are experiencing loss, grief, sadness or struggling with an uncomfortable change. Your emotions are valid. It's just difficult to wear your emotions around others trying to put on their good cheer. But, it's dangerous to stuff your emotions away for the sake of others.

So, here is a way you can balance your emotions and your "expectations" for behavior around others.



Imagine a hallway with 3 rooms. Room #1 is your private space where you can let down, feel, acknowledge, and just "Be" however you are in whatever set of emotions you need to have at the moment.

When it's time to be around others, enter room #2. The number two room is where you will get your wings. In this room, use gratitude as a pillow for your knees in prayer. Let your gratitude list lift you.

Then go to room #3. Here is where you ask God to give your wings wind so you have the strength to go about your day, to attend church, and to be with loved ones during the holidays.

Gratitude gives grief it's wings and God gives those wings the wind to endure. You can make it through, but do reach out to us in your counseling center if this season is too difficult for you. We are here for you to help you find the "happy" in your "holidays."

Sweet Dreams—Bring in Twin sized bedding

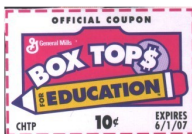

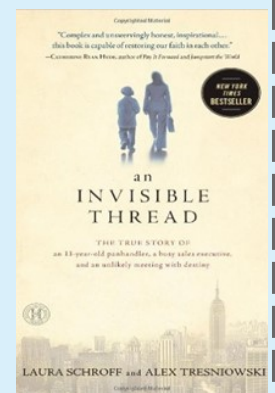
