It is that simple, and it is why I'm inviting all of us to go back to the basics, the "Jesus Follower 101" version of our faith.



Throughout history, when God called his people to ministry, they have been commissioned to continue carrying on God's work. On October 30, 2022, this tradition was continued with the seven who responded to God's call to become a Stephen Minister.

Each Stephen Minister has completed substantial weekly training for a period of five months to be equipped for the ministry.

Stephen Ministers are men and women who are dedicated, talented, compassionate, spirit-filled servants of God. They are comfortable with emptying themselves and putting their faith in God as the care giver while they act as caregivers.

Stephen Ministers come from all walks of life. Some come from professional backgrounds; some have raised their families. Some come from a place where they have had to address their own grief from loss. Some come from broken families and broken hearts. Stephen Ministers are just like everyone else. They were hurt or broken and found healing so that they could extend their hands to others to offer Christian care.

Stephen Ministers are frequently called on by our pastors to provide

needed one-on-one ministry to people in the congregation and community who are experiencing divorce, grief, unemployment, hospitalization, a terminal illness, relocation, loneliness, a spiritual crisis or life's other difficulties, or to be a good and confidential listener for someone who needs encouragement.

LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR!

Spring to me is always a season of action! It is a verb as well as a season after all. Newness, flowers blooming, rebirth. So it seems appropriate that we focus on the season of HOPE transforming into the action of HELP as we look at serving and missions for Spring.

In Galatians 6:2, we are asked to 'Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.' This is not necessarily an easy task when we look around at the need in our community and even more so globally. At times it can be overwhelming, who do we support? What are best uses of our resources and time etc. This is where we look at hope, how can we give someone the hope to continue when they struggle? Is the kindness of a stranger buying Christmas gifts for your children enough? Will a veteran receiving toiletry supplies feel hope? So perhaps the task is easier than we thought, and a series of small helping actions verses something large or grand. I'm so excited about spring, 2023 and where we may get called to action. 
